<p>English</p> <p>Phonics</p> <p>Grammar- tenses, commas, exclamation/question marks and looking at different types of sentences.</p> <p>Handwriting-practise basic diagonal and horizontal joins linked to Letter Join.</p> <p>Comprehension-differentiated exercises.</p> <p>Non-Fiction-fact files about Kenya; reading information and using this to create their own fact file.</p> <p>Story writing- describing characters, settings, introductions, endings, improving and enhancing work with better words and phrases, Traditional stories and stories from other cultures.</p>			
<p>Mathematics</p> <p>Addition and subtraction-adding and subtracting two-digit number and tens and adding 3 numbers.</p> <p>Money-adding and subtracting near multiples of ten to find totals, using different coins to find a given total and working out change.</p> <p>Statistics-Venn and Carroll diagrams and tally charts.</p> <p>Multiplication-2, 5 and 10 times tables.</p> <p>Fractions- $\frac{1}{2}$ $\frac{1}{4}$ and $\frac{1}{3}$ and finding simple equivalent fractions.</p>			
<p>Science</p> <p><i>Animals including humans</i></p> <p>Notice that animals, including humans have offspring which grown into adults.</p> <p>Find out about and describe the basic needs of animals, including humans, for survival.</p> <p>Describe the importance for humans of exercise, eating the right amounts of different types of food, and hygiene.</p>			
<p>Religious Education</p> <p>Exploring other religions-Islam.</p> <p>Compare Islamic and Christian places of worship.</p> <p>Look at the similarities and differences between the Christian and Islamic creation stories.</p> <p>Think about the importance of learning about a different religion.</p>			
<p>Art and Design/Design Technology</p> <p>Puppets</p> <p>Explore different types of puppets</p> <p>Design, measure, mark out and make own puppets - theme of super heroes</p> <p>Learn to use a needle and thread.</p> <p>Make Kenyan-style mask.</p>			
<p>Computing</p> <p>Simulations</p> <p>To know how to enter data into a computer simulation.</p> <p>To know that computer simulations are simplified representations.</p> <p>To explore the effects of changing the variables in simulations and use them to make and test predictions.</p> <p>Programme Floor turtles/Beebots.</p>
