Children in school year 1 and above need to have their own programme and must not sit on an adult's lap. Please also note that pushchairs must be left outside school and are not permitted in the hall. All our children will have had the opportunity to see the dress rehearsal. Performances will take place at 4pm on Thursday, 30th March 2017 and Friday, 31st March 2017. Children in Year 3 and Year 4 will not go home at the normal time and should bring a snack to school on performance days which they will be able to eat just before the performance. Thank you.
