Weekly spelling lists

- Continue to read and discuss an increasingly wide range of fiction, poetry, plays, non-fiction and reference books or textbooks.
- Identify how language, structure and presentation contribute to meaning.
- Identify and discuss themes and conventions in and across a wide range of writing
- Discuss and evaluate how authors use language, including figurative language, considering the impact on the reader.
- Distinguish between statements of fact and opinion.
- Note and develop initial ideas, drawing on reading and research where necessary.
- Ensure the consistent and correct use of tense throughout a piece of writing.
- Proofread for spelling and punctuation errors.

Mathematics

- compare and order fractions whose denominators are all multiples of the same number
- identify, name and write equivalent fractions of a given fraction, represented visually, including tenths and hundredths
- recognise mixed numbers and improper fractions and convert from one form to the other and write mathematical statements > 1 as a mixed number [for example, $2/5 + 4/5 = 6/5 = 1 \frac{1}{5}$]
- add and subtract fractions with the same denominator and denominators that are multiples of the same number
- multiply proper fractions and mixed numbers by whole numbers, supported by materials and diagrams
- read and write decimal numbers as fractions [for example, $0.71 = 71/100$]
- recognise and use thousandths and relate them to tenths, hundredths and decimal equivalents
- round decimals with two decimal places to the nearest whole number and to one decimal place
- read, write, order and compare numbers with up to three decimal places
- solve problems involving number up to three decimal places

- recognise the per cent symbol (%) and understand that per cent relates to 'number of parts per hundred', and write percentages as a fraction with denominator 100, and as a decimal
- solve problems which require knowing percentage and decimal equivalents of $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{1}{4}$, $\frac{1}{5}$, $\frac{2}{5}$, $\frac{4}{5}$ and those fractions with a denominator of a multiple of 10 or 25.

Science

- Describe the movement of the Earth, and other planets, relative to the sun in the solar system.
- Describe the movement of the Moon relative to the Earth.
- Describe the Sun, Earth and Moon as approximately spherical bodies.
- Use the idea of the Earth's rotation to explain day and night and the apparent movement of the sun across the sky.

- Explain beliefs about how inspirational people can bring believers closer to God.
- Describe examples of texts or quotes which explain what an ideal way of life might be.
- Compare different inspiring leaders from different religions.
- Make clear connections between belief about living a good life and the leaders they study.
- Give examples of the impact of faith on life.
- Explain differences between leaders from different religions.
- Raise questions about the concept of 'inspirational people', suggesting good answers.
- Explain the importance of role models from different religions.
- Express their own response to the inspiring lives they have studied.
