Science Workshop

British Science week has been celebrated in style as usual; each class enjoyed an exciting Forensic workshop and there was some super detective work. KS2 travelled back in time in an interactive learning journey about the fossils under our feet (in Dunstable!) Year Six were visited by a microbiologist from The Francis Crick Institute (Kings Cross). They were completely engaged with their observational work using individual microscopes - there are now children considering this as a future career! Wow! Monday was spent working on the theme of 'Journeys': Space, The Circulatory system, the natural environment, flight, pollution, and time, which were all explored with enthusiasm, engagement and enjoyment. This week in Science has been superb.
