This Strategic Plan sets out the vision and broad ambitions for the School over the next three years. It is the job of the Board of Governors, working with the Headteacher and senior leaders, to agree a strategic plan for the coming three to five years. It is then for the senior leaders to turn the strategic plan into a School Development Plan, updated each year, and to implement this in practice with the support and scrutiny of governors.

Vision

Our children and adults will be grounded in God's word. We maintain a Christian family focus, aiming to support parents in raising their children as flourishing citizens, enabling them to handle life's challenges with courage and perseverance. We provide high-quality learning, preparing children to flourish academically and spiritually, fulfilling their God-given potential.'

To achieve this we provide a strong, Christian ethos which encourages the children to love and respect one another and to love God. "Values Education" is embedded through Christian collective worship and throughout the whole curriculum. We provide opportunities and positive role models to allow children to develop independence and responsibility.
