Section 1 – Short visits to the local area

During your child's time at Ashton St Peter's Primary School short visits are made to the local area to support curricular studies. Examples are visits to Priory Church and other places of worship, Dunstable Leisure Centre, the Town Centre, the Library, local shops and cafes, local streets and parks (including playing on the playground equipment and other outdoor games).

School visits lasting half a day or longer, or involving transportation i.e. coach travel, will require an individually signed permission slip.

This consent form will cover all such visits outlined above during your child's time at Ashton St Peter's Primary School.

I should like my child to take part in all such visits as outlined and, whilst I understand that the staff in charge of the visit will take all reasonable care of the pupils, I also understand that the school cannot be held responsible for any loss, damage or injury other than due to negligence.

Section 2 – Photographs and Video footage for Publicity Events and School Website

- The safety of all our children is paramount

Pupils' Internet Safety Rules

RULES FOR ONLINE SAFETY AT ASHTON ST. PETER'S CHURCH OF ENGLAND VA PRIMARY SCHOOL

I will always ask the teacher before I use the Internet and will be sensible whenever I use it.

I will only use the Internet for schoolwork and will only use the sites my teacher has asked me to access.

I will not give my name, address or telephone number to anyone on the Internet and I will tell the teacher if anyone asks me for my name, address or telephone number.

I will never agree to meet someone I have spoken to on the Internet.

I will not download programs or bring programs on USB Sticks or CDs from home into school.

I will only e-mail the people my teacher has approved and the messages I send will be polite and responsible.

I will report any unpleasant material or messages sent to me. I understand this report would be confidential and would help protect other pupils and myself.

I realise that if I don't use the Internet sensibly I will not be allowed to use it.

Section 5 - Home/School Partnership Agreement

The Family/I/We will endeavour to:

- Make sure my child attends regularly, on time, wears the school uniform and is properly equipped, including PE equipment.
- Take holidays in school holidays.
- Let the school know if my child cannot attend.
- Make the school aware of any concerns and problems that might affect my child.
- Support the school's policies for personal and social development and good behaviour.
- Support my child in reading, maths or any other activities given as homework.
- Attend parents evenings and discussions about my child's progress.
- Get to know about my child's life at school.
- Attend any opportunities provided by the school to see how my child is taught. i.e. Literacy and Numeracy sessions.
- Avoid using social media and social platforms for derogatory comments towards the school and will use the appropriate channels to raise issues/concern

- Provide a balanced curriculum and meet your child's individual needs.
- Provide opportunities to nurture your child's spiritual, moral, social and cultural development.
- Inform you of your child's progress at formal consultation meetings twice a year. Send you a written report each June/July.
- Be available at any reasonable time after school to discuss your child's progress.
- Keep you informed about general school matters through newsletters, workshops, assemblies etc.
- Keep you informed of the homework requirements for each year group.
- Let you know about any concerns or problems that are affecting your child and work with you to resolve them.
- Inform you about what the teachers aim to teach your child each term.
- Be open and welcoming at all times and offer opportunities for you to become involved in the life of the school.

The pupil will endeavour to:

- Attend school regularly and on time.
- Be friendly, polite and helpful to others.
- Do all class work and homework as well as possible.
- Take good care of the buildings, grounds and equipment.
- Wear the school uniform and be tidy in appearance.

Together we will endeavour to:

- Support all pupils.
- Encourage your child to do his/her best in all aspects of school life.
